Here we are: half-way through the year and time once again for the club's Metro Metric an event we've been sponsoring for almost 30 years. In the face of declining participation by riders and mostly very hot weather we manage to put on an event most everyone really enjoys. We congratulate all those volunteer's time and effort and especially the event chair, Phil Keller.

On a more somber note, I would like to mention rider safety. Perhaps I am wrong, but it seems to me the club has been experiencing an increase in rider crashes—some serious some not. My concern is that the faster we ride the more important it is to pay close attention not only to the road but to those riders around us. Riding in a tight group at a fast pace doesn't leave much time to react to other riders and changes in traffic and road geometry.

I have also observed riders blowing through stop signs, red lights, and riding too far into the road lane. My worst fear was realized this week reading about the Chicago rider who crashed with another rider and then was hit by a passing truck and killed while riding an organized race in Peoria County. Please everyone let's pay attention and be safe.

I apologize, again, for a late newsletter. It seems my good intentions keep getting abused by my work schedule. I'll probably get it worked out by the end of this year.



# **Busse Woods Bike Trail To Close Temporarily**

The 11 mile trail through and around Busse Woods will be closed from July 5th until August 3rd for crack filling and seal coating. According to Joe Mollica, Project Manager, the south side of the trail will have the cracks filled and then seal coated. The crack fill leaves a ridge that requires the seal coat to smooth the surface, added Mollica. In addition, Mollica said the two greatest problems encountered during this and previous trail projects are: users ignoring the closed signs and weather conditions. He cautions that the material used, if gotten on shoes and clothing will needlessly ruin them.

While the project is scheduled to be completed by August 3rd, weather could either speed up or slow the project. The material used requires warm dry weather and sunlight. Mollica mention the Elk pens as being particularly difficult to complete because of the shade from overhanging trees.

#### President - Ray Dal Lago

- Proposed making the Winter 24hr rule effective year round club rides.

#### Phil Keller-Treasurer

- Expenses for 2007 are \$4200 less than in 2006.

#### Petra Hofmann-Newsletter Editor

center-of-balance while cornering, informative and entertaining. Members were given the opportunity to participate in these demonstrations and to ask questions afterward.







cold drinks. Naturally, after the rain stopped, it became quite warm and humid—another enjoyable attribute of the Metro Metric.

#### How did the name Metro Metric come about?

Chuck Ziemer told of the time he was riding with a few other members and they were trying to come with a name for the ride. "We decided on Metro Metric because, at the time, the ride was 30 and 60 miles," he said. Chuck remembers one year of severe flooding near Oswego. "The flooding was so bad we had to come up with a new route segment which turned out to be a portion of Route 34. That was the worst because of the number of riders and the amount of traffic, especially the trucks," he added.
