The EBC board has been considering donations over the last several board and club meetings. Several club members offered their suggestions. At the December club meeting, Club President John Park stated that the Board had approved the motion to donate to the following organizations: **\$100** to League of Illinois Bicyclists; \$100 to Friends of the Calumet-Sag Trail; **\$100** to Illinois Trails Conservancy (former Rails to Trails) and **\$1,800** to *Project Mobility* which is supported by The Bike Rack, one of our sponsors and located in St.Charles, IL. Project Mobility provides adapted tricycles/bicycles to physically challenged individuals and was founded

by Hal Honeyman of the Bike Rack. This worthy cause was suggested by club member Susan Sperl.

An Adapted Versa Trike was chosen at a cost of \$2,410. EBC donated \$1,800 and Pussanee and George Pastorino generously donated the difference of \$610 to make the purchase of the bike possible. President John Park and George Pastorino presented the Adapted Versa Trike to Caleb, an 11 year old boy who has a rare genetic disorder called Ring 18 syndrome. Caleb's gleaming face and gestures brought tears of gratitude and happiness to his parents, Bob and

Juliana as well as to his two little brothers and the entire EBC audience. Caleb's father spoke of his and his wife's profound gratitude to the club. Pictures were taken. Hal Honeyman offered a few words about *Project Mobility*, his interest in people with physical challenges and also mentioned the upcoming *Wounded Warriors Ride* in June, 2011.



EBC and Google Groups by C. Dean

At the December Club meeting, Maria K. told us that club membership stood at 495, including 103 family memberships and 243 individual memberships. So, there were 346 memberships. At about the same time, Google Groups told us that there were 340 members on the 'listserv' (list server). I'd be curious to know what the overlap was between the two sets of members. I suspect that it is high – over 90%. But, not every member of the EBC is a member of the EBC Google Group.

A little more than a year ago, despite having been a member of the EBC since 1993 and despite having the same email address throughout that whole period of time (which was published in the club directory each year), I was not on the listserv. In retirement, as I was doing more club rides and socializing at the coffee shops during the ride breaks and hearing about all the emails fellow riders were receiving, I finally asked Susan S. to explain to me why I was not getting these emails. "Well, you're not on the listserv." Once she (she was the listsery administrator at that time) added my email address to the listsery, I started to see the emails that people were discussing. As many of you already know, you may be receiving 6 or 7 emails per day initiated by fellow EBC'ers and distributed via Google Groups. But, did you know that you can control how and if you get these emails? And did you know (do you remember) that you can see the emails (the 'posts') by reviewing them directly at the Google Groups web site even if you already are used to seeing the emails on your local email account (AOL, GMAIL, Comcast, etc.)? I suspect that most of us receive these club emails on whatever service we are used to using to get most (if not all) of our email. But you can go directly to the EBC Google Group, login, and review current and older emails. I bookmarked (save as a favorite) the address to make it easy to go directly to EBC Google Group:

Once on the Google website, there is quite a lot of information about the club and its email habits. You can see that it was May, 2008 that the club began to routinely use this service. 139 message/emails were posted that month. Average monthly volume in 2008 was a little less than 150 per month. In 2009 and 2010 respectively, the average monthly volume was approximately 200 and 215 messages per month. You can also see the members and their stats regarding their usage of the service. Our ride leaders – such as George P., Larry G., or Jeff W. – are frequent posters, but so too are some of the administrative people such as the Ride Captain or mileage data base administrator.

Regarding the earlier first question, you can control how and if you receive the EBC GG emails by making choices directly on Google Groups. There are 4 choices: 1) 'No emails' (your email address stays on the listserv, you can see the messages by logging on to GoogleGroups, but no emails are sent to your email account); 2) 'Abridged Email' (EBC GG sends you one email per day – in the morning – that summarizes all the new messages that members have sent since your receipt of yesterday's summarized abridged email. This summary includes the subject line and sender name of the poster; and it is 'abridged' because it only contains the first few words of the message. You can easily click on a 'more' link to see the rest of the message if you so desire.); 3) 'Digest Email' (EBC GG sends you one email per day – in the morning – and it includes the full text of all the messages that were posted since yesterday.); and, 4) 'Email' (EBC GG sends you an email with the text of the sender each time a sender posts a message.)

You can make these selections by clicking on 'Edit my membership' when you are on the Google EBC website. Happy New Year EBC'ers. Keep communicating in 2011.

Southern DuPage County Regional Trail Progess Reporter November, 2010 suggested by Bob Hoel

With many of our club rides being initiated from the IMAX parking lot on Rt 83 at 63rd, it seems like a natural to re-publish information about bicycle routes in southern DuPage County. Here is information from their recent issue:

FINAL SEGMENT OF SOUTHERN TRAIL IS UNDERWAY!

Madison Street Bikeway Goes to Construction

Work is underway on the last segment of the Southern DuPage County Regional Trail from Willowbrook Centre Parkway north to the eastern terminus in Hinsdale. Louruzz Construction is building an extension of the existing sidepath on Madison northward to Plainfield Road. DuPage County Division of Transportation will install striping and signage northward to 59th Street to create a bicycle lane. The last component is a signed bicycle route which ends the regional trail at Robbins Park and Hinsdale Community House at 8th Street. From this endpoint, trail users can continue on Hinsdale's community bikeway system.

With completion of this last segment, trail users will be able to go from Burr Ridge and Hinsdale west to Aurora and Naperville on 46 miles of bikeways which:

- Link 6 DuPage County Forest Preserves containing over 5900 acres
- Connects the 11 communities of Aurora; Naperville; Woodridge; Darien; Bolingbrook; Downers Grove; Westmont; Clarendon Hills; Willowbrook; Burr Ridge; Hinsdale and unincorporated areas of Naperville, Lisle and Downers Grove Townships serving an estimated population of 500,000.
- Are within easy access of 54 local schools and 62 local parks
- Represent a successful cooperative intergovernmental effort by area municipalities, park districts, townships, DuPage County Division of Transportation, and the Forest Preserve District of DuPage County to construct a new regional trail based on a concept plan adopted in 2002.

TRAIL ROUTE FINALIZED ALONG WILLOWBROOK CENTRE PARKWAY

Congratulations to the Village of Willowbrook on completion of Willowbrook Centre Parkway (the 75th Street extension to Madison Street). As a result, trail users now have a wider on-street route to connect from the 75th Street trail segment to the Madison Street trail

Willowbrook undertook an innovative process to construct this roadway extension due to poor soils discovered along the route of the planned roadway. Soil was compacted on site to consolidate the underlying soil and through the work of local officials and staff, geotechnical engineers, and surveyors, the compaction process was completed in 2006 and construction began in 2008.

With the completion of this route, the temporary route which was previously signed along Quincy and Executive was removed and signage installed along the permanent route.

Free trail guides showing the trail route with off-road & on-road segments, amenities and parking areas are available by contacting DuPage County at 630-407-6883 or dfagan@dupageco.org.

Copies of the trail guides are available at municipal halls, park districts, townships, libraries, and bicycle shops throughout the area. The final version of the trail guide will be published in early 2011.

DuPage County will also be working with local agencies to install "You Are Here" map signs along the entire trail route once construction is completed.
