Dear EBC Members,

Saturday (September 14) we had great weather, fun EBC cycling buddies, a wonderful ride, delicious sandwiches, yummy ice cream, and a great day of cycling; what more could you want.



We met in Morton Grove and pedaled to the North Shore. Everyone looked happy as we rode, but it looked like a rough crowd of riders. I was excited to be out with my new bike. Everyone helped me learn how to ride a road type of bike, including Mike Arends who sent me an email with good advice; thank you to everyone. A special thank you to Steve Josephs who came to show me how to ride a road bike and practice riding a paceline.

We rode by Jim McMahon's, former BEARS quarterback, \$5 million+ home in Northbrook. Our first stop was the velodrome, named after Ed Rudolph who trained 1972 Olympic Gold Medalist Ice Speed Skater Anne Henning. A few of us rode on the track. The ride continued until the optional sprint. Steve Josephs and I rode 19-22 mph in a paceline for a few miles. After the sprint we went to buy our delicious sandwiches at Bluffington's Cafe in Lake Bluff. It's a popular cafe used by most cycling clubs and cyclists in the area. We took our sandwiches to the Sunrise Park nearby so we could enjoy lunch at a peaceful location overlooking Lake Michigan. Then we rode through Fort Sheridan where General George Patton once lived.

After lunch the riders started rumbling about how we were on a Mansion Ride, but we had not seen any mansions. I told John Park (JP), the riders were getting rowdy and restless. The next stop was the Lake Forest Cemetery, where John Hughes is buried. He was the director and screenwriter of Ferris Bueller's Day Off, Home Alone, The Breakfast Club, and more. We took a quick ride around the cemetery. Once again, JP refused to ride inside the cemetery, and he waited outside. Apparently, some years ago, JP and Roland Porter were inside the cemetery, suddenly Roland's bike accidentally fell on him. JP was not sure it was an accident, and claims "something" forced Roland's bike to fall on him. It's a spooky story, so

we all left quickly. Along the ride we now saw some mansions, enough to calm down the group. Next, we visited Frank Lloyd Wright's only freestanding bridge, the Bluff Ravine Bridge. It was built in 1915, along with several homes he designed nearby.

JP was having trouble with his GPS cell phone all day. We had a few Jeff Wincentsen Shriners, you know, when the Ride Leader makes a wrong turn and everyone has to make a u-turn. We also had a couple of sidewalk sneaks, rough brick streets, and a fire emergency detour. There were three fire trucks with flashing red lights on the route so we had to stop. JP got upset because they were blocking our ride, and asked me to scout the area to see if we could ride in between the trucks. I rode up and the fireman said they had just finished with the fire. I rode back and told JP and the riders we should go around. One of the riders led us to a shortcut that took us right where the same police officer was standing. I apologized to him and said we took a wrong turn. Another cyclist was there and jokingly said we were going to be arrested. JP quickly took us away to visit the original Home Alone house.



By this time everyone was asking about the ice cream stop. After one final JW-Shriner, we stopped by Hartigan's Ice Cream for some delicious Wisconsin ice cream cones. We rode a few more miles and finished a wonderful day of cycling.




