SAFETY FIRST! By Baltimore Ortega

At the last EBC meeting I volunteered for the position of Safety Chair. I want to thank the board for accepting my appointment, and the EBC Members for your help and support. A special thanks to Larry Gitchell for being the previous Safety Chair.

I am new to the position, and will be working to review our safety information and policies. My focus will be to help everyone have safe and fun rides all year. There are many safety issues and concerns. In general, most of our members are safe, careful, and cautious when riding. However, there are a few riders who sometimes forget to follow the safety rules. Rather than give you a long list of safety rules and issues, let's start with a few.


SINGLE FILE

Last year I was leading a ride with some members who were very friendly and social. Several members were riding next to each other enjoying their conversation, and not paying attention to the traffic. We called out car back and single file, but for some reason a few riders did not move to the edge and get in line. It wasn't a concern on the side streets with no traffic; however, it was a big concern on the busy streets.

- 1. Our first big focus will be to ride single file on busy streets, and when conditions require extra safety. If someone calls "CAR BACK," please get in a single file for your safety and the safety of the group. When everyone gets in a single file, make sure you are by the edge of the road. Riding single file in the middle of the lane is not safe; move to the curb. Ride Leaders and fellow riders can remind cyclists to ride single file and be safe, especially on busy streets. If you hear "CAR BACK!" what do we do? Yes, quickly get in a single file, if you are not already in one.
- 2. This is from Ted Sward, a former Safety Chair. Thanks Ted:

Do not call "Clear"! When passing through intersections or crossing roads some riders say "Clear" if there is no cross traffic. This is a dangerous practice that should be abandoned. It encourages riders to follow the leader, letting others do their thinking for them. Each rider is responsible for verifying that the way is indeed clear."

I notice sometimes members send the club safety information, please continue. If you have any ideas, concerns, or suggestions, please contact me directly. Thank you, and remember, SAFETY FIRST!





Meeting Minutes April

Board Minutes April 10, 2014

- President: The Board Meeting was called to order at 6:15pm at the Community Bank of Elmhurst.
 - Todd Pavloski was present at the board meeting to discuss redesigning the member miles database and making the maintenance process web-based. He stated that the various processes (mileage documentation) could possibly be streamlined, and work more efficiently for whoever takes over Nancy Shack's (Database Manager) position. Todd will work along with the new person, learning the current process as a new program is developed. The MS $\mbox{\sc Access}$ program is used to run the program as it is. It was also requested that Cindy Reedy work with Todd, and the new Database Manager. A web based data entry program is going to be pursued, similar to the program that is used to list the rides.

responsibilities as Database Manager; and had hoped to attend but could not be here tonight.

- Kim Messina requested \$150 for flyers, to promote Elmhurst Family Rides June 15, July 20, and Aug 10. Motion was made and passed to purchase flyers. These would be placed at the Elmhurst Park District, local bike shops, and a few
- A request was made to purchase a gift certificate for the Database Manager, to thank her for all the work she has done for the club for the last 5 years.
- Secretary: The March 13, 2014 Board Meeting Minutes were not read, but have been published in the EBC website. Minutes can be viewed on the EBC website in the newsletter.
- Treasurer: The Treasurer reported: Monthly Banking Summary (03/13/2014 -04/10/2014) Listed income was \$2,303.50; expenses were \$3,684.42. Total Banking balance at this time: \$14,945.24
- VP/Ride Captain: No report / ride captain not present.
- 5. Newsletter Editor: No report.
- 6. Membership Coordinator: Total membership - Single 180; Family membership - 235; Total - 415.
- Advocacy: A check was for \$250 was given to Bob Hoel for reimbursement for some of his expenses for attending the National Bike Summit. Originally \$200 was requested, to be split with Ray Dal Lago who also attended the summit. A motion was stated to approve the original check, giving \$125 each to cover some of their expenses.
- 8. Safety: Larry Gitchell is no longer a member of the club and a replacement for his position, Safety Coordinator, is needed. A request will be made at the General Meeting.


