Tom contacted club Safety officer Baltimore Ortega prior to tonight's meeting, and wanted his opinion on the Barrington Hills controversy. Key topics of Baltimore's response:

- Our club should present safety ideas regarding Barrington, for all areas we cycle.
- We should be aware of Barrington's issues with cyclists, but focus on general rules of cycling and

- 7. Contribution for the Blind Stoker Ride program. There is a need for a more comfortable bike seat for Blind Stokers. Kim requested EBC to consider making a donation to provide the needed seats. Tom suggested to check with club members first, to see who may have extra seats. A ride to Working Bikes is scheduled for Saturday, and this would be a good place to look for seats.


