The 47th Hilly Hundred by Chuck Dean

Is it the HH, or the HHH, or the HHH? Club members have heard of, and in some cases attended, the Horsey Hundred (KY), the Horrible Hilly Hundreds (WI), and the Hotter-than-Hell Hundred (TX), but I want to recap this year's Hilly Hundred, October 10-11, near Bloomington, Indiana. (Allow for a 4 hour drive [250 miles] from the western 'burbs and remember the time zone change from Central to Eastern.) It's a 2-day invitational, the 47th this year, sponsored by CIBA (Central Indiana Bicycling Association). In recent years, the 100 miles tend to be split approximately 55 on Saturday and 45 on Sunday. Registration costs \$65 if you don't wait until the last minute. Southern Indiana, similar to southern Illinois, can be very hilly - duh! Hence its name. Scenery in Owen, Monroe, and Morgan counties at any time of the year is delightful, but the fall color turn is special. Driving down route 37 south of Indianapolis presents gorgeous colorful murals around every bend in the road. The nooks and crannies and 'hollers' on either side of Route 37 are nestled into scenic hills splashed with tumble-down barns and silos, and modern upto-date ones as well. Livestock can be found on many of the farms. The Hilly frequently has 4-5,000 riders. There are many experienced club and non-club riders, but lots of novices, college students, and others who turnout for this ride. It is a ride that begs for caution - not unreasonably - because of the close proximity of so many riders coupled with the challenges of the hills themselves. Rural roads can also be full of pot holes; but the ride organizers do a very good job of marking the holes with signs and florescent paint outlines. Hills offer challenges in both directions: up and down. Roadside signs offer advance warning of a sharp turn at the bottom of a hill; speed must be controlled. The biggest concern on the uphills is the occasional rider that abruptly stops in front of you just before he is about to fall over. You'll also find a lot walkers pushing their bikes up the hill. Most of the roads are conveniently bereft of traffic, except for cyclists. The few roads or intersections that have much traffic tend to have police officers insuring a safe crossing.

Rest stops are plentiful (typical as with most invitational rides) with plenty of snacks, food, water, and porta-potties. Deserving special mention are the enroute chicken dinners at the mid-point rest stop each day. No one is going to go hungry. Several of the rest stops on Saturday and Sunday have live music. Blue grass, country and western, and some 'rock' are sure to entertain. At the high school marking the start and end of the ride, a huge tent is erected with dozens of vendors hawking bicycles and bicycle-wares. Parts, tubes, tires, clothing, mirrors, shoes, helmets, and on and on – they are all present. The weather in early October can range from down-right chilly to surprisingly warm, but in the last five years I'd say it generally starts out cool in the morning (low 40's) to mid-50's later. Are Your Garmin Maps Up-to-Date? by Chuck Dean

I'm not sure how many EBCers have Garmin devices that they take with them (or mount on their bicycles) when they ride, but I know there are some. I don't have one that I take along when riding myself, but I do have an inexpensive model (Nuvi 40LM) that I have used in the car for several years. I paid the extra \$20 for lifetime map updates when I purchased it, but have never been able to get the map updates to be loaded on to the device via my personal computer. My device now routinely reminds me that its maps are out-ofdate. While I've not experienced a real problem because of the out-of-date maps, I thought I should try harder to get them updated.

I'm happy to now report that the maps have been updated. How? I took my device to the Garmin store in downtown Chicago, 663 N. Michigan Ave. It took about 30 minutes including the wait time (10 minutes) to be seen by a technician. Garmin does not charge anything for the service; it's free. I did have to buy a 4 gig micro memory card (\$15) as I never previously added a card to my device. If I had already had a memory card in the device, I would not have had to buy another. (I witnessed another customer getting his maps updated who did not have to buy a card because he already had one in his device; and therefore there was no charge at all for the update procedure.) When my device was new, all the maps and lists of restaurants, hotels, and other points of interest (POI) fit within the capacity of the internal memory. But now, 3 years later, maps have more details and the lists of POIs are longer requiring the expanded memory of an SD card.

So, if you have been living with out-of-date maps in your device, consider a trip to the Garmin store. You can combine your trip with a lunch and a walk to nearby Millennium Park. On a recent Monday, my wife and I did just that.


