## For Want of a Nail ... or screw or bolt or whatever that thing is By Chuck Dean

Accidents and incidents are never far away when you are bike riding. Making sure that your equipment is properly maintained and stowed helps to keep these pests at bay.

Tom Preston shared this vig nette: To keep us sheltered from the cold northeast winds and to allow us to see more flowering trees, Bill "the man with the detailed neighborhood street map in his head" Schwartz led us on a twisty, turney ride this morning (Tuesday, April 26). When we arrived at Panera, I twisted my left foot to unclip; but I stayed attached to the pedal and made a graceful left roll to the concrete and ended up with my Lemond straight up in the air and still clipped to the left pedal. Phil Kohl kindly took my bike and as I was standing up, I noticed one of the screws which hold the cleat to the bottom of my shoe on the concrete right where I had stopped. So while others ordered coffee, I dug the multi-tool out and reattached the cleat securely to my shoe. I went ahead and tightened the screws on my right shoe too. Luckily the screw fell out at Panera and not a block before. I don't want to even think about riding the second half of a ride clipped in on one side only. When I got home I put a set of cleats and screws in the little bag under my saddle.

Have you checked your screws lately?

While it is true that a lot of us EBCers have a screw loose, Eric Peterson did correctly point out that those are bolts, not screws. And Tom got a chance to use the "stored cleats and screws (stored) in the little bag under (his) saddle" only three days later. Tom and I turned back early on Isaac's Friday ride (April 29) at Route 59 to accompany Steve Joseph whose bike suffered a broken rear derailluer when his jacket popped out of his pocket and fouled the derailluer. So the 2nd safety warning is a familiar one about the consequences of improperly stowed equipment such as removed clothes, untied shoes, worn or tattered booties (Kathy W. will know this reference). Please be careful.

Three days later? Oh yeah, On the way back with Steve, we stopped for a potty break at the gas station in Winfield. Tom did not fall over this time, but that pesky "screw" came loose again and almost toppled him. He replaced the cleat and nut with a new set before we left the gas station.

  - John Loesch, EBC ride leader who organizes Blind Stoker Rides for the visually impaired, has made arrangements for blind stokers to participate in the Bike the Drive on May 29. John has asked if EBC would reimburse 50% of the cost of the EBC member who captains a blind stoker. Currently if the EBC member registers using Women Bike Chicago code WBC15, the cost is \$40. EBC would reimburse \$20 to the EBC rider who captains the blind stoker. This motion was passed to reimburse 50% of the Bike the Drive cost of the captain.

- President: The General Meeting was called to order at 7:15 p.m. at the Community Bank of Elmhurst.
  - A Ride Leader Recognition Program has been established to award the top 20 Ride Leaders who lead the most rides. This will be in addition to the Ride Leader jersey that is given out every 3 years, to those who lead 30 or more rides, hikes, snowshoeing, or canoeing events. Those who have led rides in 2014 and 2015 will be grandfathered in the original Ride Leader award program (15 rides or events). The new program, effective 2016 will now award a \$50 gift certificate from the EBC Club sponsor of the Ride Leader's choice. The EBC mileage page will be revised to include details of rides lead by ride leaders.

- 2. Mileage Coordinator: John Reardon is completely transitioned to his new role as Mileage Coordinator, which previously was handled by Peter Gough. John is now updating the mileage database and the Members Miles web page on a regular basis. Please take a picture of your sign-in sheet and scan/send it to him. Please do not send a fax. By mail or sent in as an email is preferred.
- 3. Secretary Report: The Hillside Public Library is having a Bike to the Library Day on Saturday, May 21. As part of this Event, several EBC members will be volunteering an hour to discuss bike safety checks, family bike rides, and wearing helmets. A link for the Bike Safety Quiz is being included in their promotional materials. Those completing the quiz are encouraged to bring in their certificate for a little prize. A ride to this event will be scheduled, which will continue beyond the event to a restaurant.
- 4. Vice President/Ride Captain Please be aware when riding on the road to stay on the right side of the road, and not in the middle. Riding 2 abreast is acceptable when there are no cars, but riding single file is required when cars are present. The Sweep should announce 'Car Back' and riders should move to the far right where we belong. This rule is all about riding safely.

- 10. Safety Chairman George Hardwidge: Did you know that if your front wheel taps the rear wheel of the rider ahead of you, you are going down. And you are going down hard. No matter how gentle the tap is the physics are such that you cannot recover. And you may bring the rider ahead of you down as well. If others are following too close, they may crash too. Just a little something to think about next time you are riding too close on the other person's wheel. A good rule of thumb: always keep at least one bike length between you and the rider ahead of you. Keep a handle bar width between you and the rider next to you.

#### 11. Mountain Bike Coordinator:

- Palos trails are looking good for rides. A trail cleanup is being planned, but no date has been set yet. Please note: August 7, is the CAMBR Meltdown a mountain bike race which is a major fund raising event for CAMBR. Many volunteers are needed, and there is always a bike ride and refreshments are involved. More details to follow.
- Single Track Mountain Bike lessons dates have not been set, but if you want to learn skills to ride more comfortably, look for an email announcing training offered in June and July.
- Pool Parties at the Pastorino's: Last Sunday of June / July / August. There are Mountain Bike or Road Rides of various skill levels, and then afterwards the Pastorino's host riders at their home for a pool party.
- 12. **Refreshments:** Thanks to Cheri O'Riordan for tonight's refreshments
- 13. **Sponsorship:** Two new sponsors! Prairie Path Cycles has locations in Batavia and Winfield and Amlings Cycle is

  - Mike Struglinski: Spoke of Working Bikes in Chicago, a nonprofit organization which collects old bikes and parts, for selling or donating to those in need of a form of transportation. Also his friend Dennis makes jerseys for those who ride recumbent bicycles. The pockets will be in the front of the jersey, instead of the back. Life Behind Bars is his company.




