Spotting is a technique where fellow riders stand on either side of the trail to catch a rider in case he or she fails to overcome a technical spot and may fall while attempting to overcome a rising spot. Elizabeth showed a lot of pluck by trying and you can hear her joyous sounds after succeeding the very first time. The video George took is wild! This is what mountain biking is all about: helping fellow riders and camaraderie of the riders.
